yes that's the book for me! It's important to read the Bible not merely for information, but also for transformation. The aim should be to meet God and focus on building a stronger relationship with Him. (Ref. Romans 12:1-2) The Bible is our definitive source for the answers to our questions about God. (Ref. 2 Timothy 3:16) Ultimately, it shows us God's character. The Bible also helps us renew our minds so we can know God's Will.

(Again Ref. Romans 12:2) One of the most important reasons to read the Bible is for increased knowledge of God that leads to an increased love of God. "To know Him is to love Him." As we see God's character revealed in Scriptures, our affection, awe and reverence with God only grows. (Ref. 1 John 4:7-16) Don't be intimidated by Scripture. Instead, start small. You don't have to start from the beginning. In fact, I recommend you start with the New Testament, specifically with the Gospel of John. This can start with you listening to Bible teachings online, reading Christian resources and even children's books. Look for Jesus throughout Scripture. Start by asking questions and having conversations. Get to know Jesus' personality, His ways, His values and the actions He takes.

Start small

consider reading the Bible for just 20 minutes a day. It will transform your life. It is my fervant prayer that the Holy Spirit gives us all a desire to learn from God's Word and that He leads us as we study the scriptures.

"Encourage" The Passage: Acts 9:26-28; 11:21-26

The point - Encourgaement strenthens realationships

The Bible Meets Life. We've been encouraged all our lives to take our vitamins. So we do. Since the 1940s, we've been popping them in our mouths daily. We know we need these important vitamins and minerals, and even though a healthy diet is likely to give us all we need, half of us buy multivitamins or supplements. A daily dose is good for us. We could use a "daily dose" of something else, too. Let's call a spiritual and emotional vitamin; the vitamin of encouragement. We were created to live in relationship with others, and we hunger for the affirmation of others. We need a healthy supply of encouragement from others to grow as God intends. Just ask any athlete about the benefit they gain when they have the "home field advantage" Encouragement helps. Unfortunately, too many of us face a deficiency in this area. Our lives and our relationships can grow weak without encouragement. Barnabas was a natural encourager. His life challenges us to be a source of encouragement to others. We support the other person and strengthen our relationship when we look for ways to offer encouragement. The Setting. When most Christians think of the apostle Paul, they picture the tieless, passionate servant of Christ who traveled throughout the Roman Empire preaching the gospel and planting churches. Yet before he met the risen Christ on the road to

Damascus, Paul the apostle was Saul the Pharisee and persecutor of the church. Because of his past, initially not all Christians believed his conversion to be genuine, as Saul's initial reception by the Jerusalem believers demonstrated. Read Acts 9:26-28. Recap (A): In Acts 9, God used Barnabas to bring Saul to a place of prominence. The apostles may not have rejected Saul outright, but they certainly kept their distance. Based on his past record, Saul was not the kind of person a Christian would want to be around. Christians were known to end up in trouble -or dead when Saul came around. Even though Saul's heart had been changed completely after he had a personal encounter with Jesus, the Jerusalem believers did not dare trust him. (B) Barnaba however realized Saul was a changed man. He saw Saul as a man truly transformed by the shed blood of Christ leading to Barnabas sticking out his neck to vouch for him. The disciples may not have trusted Saul but they did trust Barnabas; so they opened the door and their hearts to Saul, and he soon became a dominant force in spreading the gospel. Read Acts 11:21-24 (A) Examine the beautiful picture Luke, the writer of Acts, painted of Barnabas's ministry. Because of persecution, believers had scattered, so that the kingdom of God advanced wherever they went. So as soon as Barnabas saw what God was doing, "he was glad and encouraged them all to remain true to the Lord with all their hearts"(v23) Barnabas surely strengthened these new saints. To be a Christian was to accept the road of suffering, but it was a journey they could make with joy. Barnabas did more than pay lip service to the joy of his faith; he embodied it. His message and conduct were in sync: "he was a good man,

full of the Holy Spirit and faith" (v.24) (B) Perhaps you are in a season when you are starving for a good word from a friend like Barnabas. Do you have someone who breathes fresh wind into your sails, who sees you your potential and pushes you to grow? If not, begin praying that the Lord would bring that person into your life. Conversely, be that kind of person in someone else's life. Is there a person in your life who seems to be sinking? Are you seeing someone wither? Be a Barnabas and be in the process of investing in another person. Both of you will be blessed. *"How can we intentionally grow"* into the role of an encourager?" Read Acts 11:25-26. The church of Jesus Christ should be the most encouraging place on earth. Homes committed to Christ should be greenhouses of growth. And they should encourage others to step up and serve. "What are some things that might get the way of people using their spiritual gifts in the church?" Encourage Others: List a specific way you could encourage the following people this week. Circle one and make it a priority in the next few days. Neighbor, Coworker, Friend, Family Member, Fellow Church Member, Store Clerk, Another person in your sphere of influence.

Wrap It Up

We might not be called to ministry in the way that Paul and Barnabas were or

impact God's kingdom known on that scale. But we should all be encouragers. And who knows? Maybe one we encourage will accomplish more than we can imagine! PRAY: Lets ask God to make us more sensitive to recognize those who might need some encouragement. Thank Him for the gift of the Holy Spirit who is our Encourager.




